Burmese Prisoner of Conscience Dr Tun Aung.

BURMA: CALL FOR THE RELEASE OF PRISONERS OF CONSCIENCE Dr Tun Aung is the Taunton Amnesty Group's current adopted prisoner of conscience in Burma.

In June 2012 he was asked by the Burmese authorities to help the

police in trying to stop violence starting due to the heightened ethnic tensions in his region. He actively tried to calm an agitated crowd – only to be arrested later by the people he had agreed to help, and charged with inciting violence, which led to his being sentenced to 17 years in prison.

In your own words, welcome his government's recent releases of prisoners of conscience and appeal for Dr Tun Aung and all remaining prisoners of conscience to have their cases reviewed as a matter of urgency, with a view to their being immediately and unconditionally released.

# Human rights in the Middle East and North Africa

The problems of the Middle East are so great that it is easy to feel overwhelmed. What can a local group do? We have decided to focus on the plight of an individual in Egypt, Azza Hilal Ahmad Suleiman. In December 2011, Azza was part of a large protest at Tahrir Square which was dispersed by soldiers; as she was leaving, she intervened to assist a young woman who was being attacked by the soldiers, and was herself brutally beaten. Her skull was fractured, and she barely escaped with her life. Despite her complaints, no-one has been held to account for what took place. Azza's case is not only worthy of support in itself, but

it is also representative of the issues of violence against women in Egypt, and the absence of legal accountability in the Egyptian military.

We also support other cases, when urgent action is required. Sadly there is no shortage of such cases.
